

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

These courses provide instruction up to the eighth grade reading level. Subject areas include reading, writing, science, social studies, mathematics, and the constitution. Instruction in life skill areas such as employment, community resources, and consumer education is also included.

Adult Secondary Education (ASE/GED)

Kishwaukee College offers GED (General Educational Development) preparation classes for those 16 years and older who are not attending high school. GED classes prepare the adult for the high school equivalency tests. They provide instruction in writing, social studies, science, literature, math, and the Constitution with emphasis on their practical applications and the total development of the learner. Individualized instruction, cooperative learning, and computer-assisted instruction enhance the learning experience. Registrations are accepted any time during the school year for GED preparation classes.

1. retention – assists students in ways to improve their class attendance;
2. transition – assists GED and ESL students and graduates in making a decision about college courses, registering for classes, and applying for financial aid;
3. career counseling – provides and interprets career interest inventories and helps in developing and Individualized Career Plan; and
4. support services – provides referrals to area service agencies for special needs of students.

GED

(General Educational Development)

Eligibility Requirements for taking GED Test:

- Applicants who are 18 years of age or older, maintained residence in the State of Illinois for at least 30 days, and are not high school graduates, but whose high school class has graduated.
- A member of the Armed Forces of the United States on active duty, who is 17 years of age or older, and who is stationed in Illinois or is a legal resident of Illinois.
- A ward of the Department of Corrections who is 17 years of age or older, or an inmate confined in any branch of the Illinois State Penitentiary or in a county correctional facility who is 17 years of age or older.
- A female who is 17 years of age or older who is unable to attend school because she is either pregnant or the mother of one or more children.
- A male 17 years of age or older who is unable to attend school because he is the father of one or more children.
- A person who is 17 years of age or older who has been a dropout for a period of at least one year.
- A person who is successfully completing an alternative education program under section 2-3.81 or Article 13A of *The School Code of Illinois*.
- A person who is enrolled in the youth education program sponsored by the Illinois National Guard (Lincoln's Challenge).

Family Literacy

Kim Crawford, Coordinator, (x291), Rm. U-118
The Family Literacy Program is funded by the Illinois State Board of Education and offers on-site child education activities for children, ages birth to seven, whose parents are attending ABE/GED/ESL classes. The program emphasizes reading readiness and language development skills that will help children as they prepare for school. Parents are able to join in parent discussions, participate in parent-child learning activities and parent education workshops. The goal of the Family Literacy Program is to improve educational opportunities for both parent and child.

Literacy Program

Pat Olson, Coordinator, (x320), Rm. U-118
The program's goal is to improve the reading, math and/or communication skills of adults (16 years and older) whose reading levels are below the 9th grade or who are learning English as a Second language. The program provides the following services to meet the literacy needs of its participants:

- 1) Tutoring - One-to-one or small group tutoring is available through volunteer tutors. Tutors are trained in teaching basic reading and/or English literacy. This free tutoring is done in local libraries and churches as well as at community and Kishwaukee College class sites.
- 2) Tutor training – Free training is available on a flexible schedule for individuals interested in being volunteer tutors. Teaching materials, support, and additional learning opportunities are provided.
- 3) ABE Learning Lab – The lab provides free internet access and programs in typing, reading, writing, and pronunciation skills. The lab is staffed by volunteer tutors who can assist with the computers, offer advice on programs and internet sites, help with questions, or practice conversation with ESL students.

Welfare/Low Income

Kishwaukee College provides instructional programs and support services to assist eligible adults in their education, training, and support service needs:

Adult Student Connections

This program offers personal and practical support to both men and women who are single parents, displaced homemakers or are pursuing nontraditional training in a career/occupational program. Nontraditional occupations are those with less than 25% made up of one gender. Assistance is provided with career planning and some scheduling. Financial assistance may include tuition and fees, textbook loan, child care, and mileage reimbursement. Counseling and referral to social service agencies for additional support services and assistance is available, as needed.

Programs for Youth

Right to Succeed

Nancy West, Instructor/Counselor (x520), Rm. U-122
This program focuses on educational and support services for students 16-21 years old who have dropped from school. The program provides classes in basic skills improvement, GED preparation, life skills and career exploration. Students are encouraged to further their education after GED completion. Counseling and referrals to other programs and services are available to students.

Teen Parent Services

This program assists teen parents who receive public assistance and have not completed their high school education. Teen parents are enrolled in GED classes and encouraged to continue further training. Additional workshops and activities are provided to help teen parents develop parenting skills and self-sufficiency.

WIA Youth Programs

DeKalb County

The WIA Youth Programs offer out-of-school youth 16 to 21 years old an opportunity to participate in short-term training that will assist them in obtaining employment. This program is funded through the Workforce Investment Act, and participants must meet income guidelines to be eligible for services.
