The Aviation Flight program combines ground training and hands-on flying experience to fully prepare you for your future in aviation. Kishwaukee College ground training includes both classroom instruction and flight simulator time. Hands-on flight experience can be completed at any flight school with proper FAA certification, including many local airports. This training may convert to college credit toward your certificate or degree program.
